# OUR LEARNING OUTCOME

Palo Alto College students connect choices, actions and consequences to ethical decision-making.



### **HOW WE MEASURE IT**

Our faculty raters look at a sample of student work taken from PAC courses across the curriculum, and rate them based on three criteria:



#### **IDENTIFICATION**

Students identify a situation in which an ethical decision is or has been required.



## MULTIPLE PERSPECTIVES

Students analyze the situation from more than one ethical perspective and explore the consequences of each decision.



## STUDENT PERSPECTIVE

Students analyze the situation from their own ethical perspective, clarifying their ethical values in the process.





## QUESTIONS AND TAKEAWAYS

### **DID WE HIT OUR TARGET?**

The current target, as determined by the Academic Assessment Committee, is **70% at 'met standard**.' Ratings **exceeded** this number for all criteria!



### **HOW OFTEN DID RATERS DISAGREE OVER SCORES?**

After norming, their scores aligned around **75%** of the time. (This is comparable to past Personal Responsibility rating cycles.) We call this percentage **interrater reliability**.

WHAT MIGHT FURTHER BOOST INTERRATER RELIABILITY? 2023-24 was the final year we used a 4-point rubric. The next time we assess Personal Responsibility at PAC, we will use an updated, 3-point rubric. This format often increases interrater reliability.
