








#### **Course Completion Rates**
















# Percentage of Students Rating their Entire Educational Experience as "Good or Excellent"














#### **Fall-to-Fall FTIC Persistence Rates**












#### **FT FTIC Comparative Persistence Rates**














#### **3-Year FT FTIC Graduation Rates**




















#### **4-Year FT FTIC Graduation Rates**
















#### **Average Time to Associate Degree**












# Students Employed and/or Enrolled Within 6 Months of Graduation












#### **Fall FT 2017 FTIC 3-Year Tracking**

















#### **Fall 2020 Headcount by Institute**












# Fall 2020 Headcount by Zip Code










#### **Degrees & Certificates Awarded by Ethnicity**












#### **Degrees & Certificates Awarded by Gender**
