What COVID-related information can you provide students with that impact your department?

Out of an abundance of caution, the Alamo Colleges District has made some temporary changes to the way we provide services to our students with disabilities. Students need to remotely self-identify with their home college's Disability Support Services Office. Reasonable Accommodations for Zoom, Internet, and Hybrid courses are provided for eligible students with disabilities.
